Hardwood Lake

This fall's road work started out by grinding pavement on the west 900 feet of Hardwood Lake Road. It was unfortunate we had to grind the pavement. The road was paved around 2005. The road held up well until the flood of 2012. The flood pushed up the old corduroy making speed bumps every 10 feet or less on the west 900 feet. No matter how slow one drove that west 900 feet you felt like a bobble head. This summer the township had the

the roadside brushing. First, our road contractor, Tom Delovely, outfitted his excavator with a hydraulic chainsaw allowing him to limb up roadside trees 14-16 feet above the road surface.
