# ROADS AND BRIDGES UPDATE

Summer is the time when the Township can complete road maintenance projects. Some of this past summer's projects included:

- ♦ Adding Class V gravel to Bergman Road, and portions of Strand Road and Reponen Road.
- ♦ Crack sealing on Homestead Road, Hardwood Lake Road, Lyndhurst Bay Road, Magney Drive, and Brower Drive.
- Five of the seven culvert

- replacements have been completed.
- ♦ Beaver problems have continued on Strand and Reponen Roads.

New home construction also occurs in the summer. Perch Lake Township requires a driveway permit for access to town roads. A

year. Watkins Spur Update. The Carlton County

Transportation Department has completed a survey and wetlands delineation for the project. A design for the new road has not been completed.

When the design is completed, the Perch Lake Town Board will schedule a public hearing on the project.

# 2020 ELECTIONS



There will be three elections at the Perch Lake Town Hall in 2020:

- 1. The Presidential Nominating Primary will be held on Tuesday, March 3, 2020.
- 2. The State Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, August 11, 2020.
- 3. The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 3,

Here are some FAQ's about the Presidential Nominating Primary:

- Will all parties participate in the presidential nomination primary? No, only major parties. Major parties are the Democratic-Farmer-Labor Party, the Grassroots-Legalize Cannabis Party, Legal Marijuana Now Party, and the Republican Party of Minnesota.
- Will all parties be on the same ballot? No, each major party will have a separate ballot.
- ♦ How will I be able to vote in the presidential nomination party? Registered voters will be able to vote at their polling place on Presidential Primary Day or by absentee ballot in the 46 days before the Presidential Primary

Day (starting January 17, 2020). A voter must request the ballot of the party of their choice. If a voter refuses to select a party, they will not be able to vote in the presidential nomination primary.

♦ Will other people know which party's ballot I request? A voter's choice of party ballot will be recorded and is private data. However, a list of who voted in a Presidential Nomination Primary and the political party each voter selected will be provided to the chair of each major political party. How a voter voted on the ballot will be confidential.

The Presidential Primary replaces a system in which Minnesota's parties had expressed presidential preference via a caucus system. The precinct caucuses will not go away. They will be held on February 25, 2020, to conduct other party business.

Board has initiated a project to describe and record town roads. There are two kinds of roads involved:

- ♦ Platted roads. The roads around Big Lake are platted and the plats describe the roads.
- Roads which were originally based on "road orders," and completed in the early twentieth century.

In October, a contractor was approved to survey and describe town roads with road orders. project.

We will soon be entering the winter season. Please remember it is illegal to obstruct a road or deposit snow or ice thereon according to MN Statute 160.2715. Last year, some of our roads became difficult to plow due to individuals pushing snow across town roads. Residents must find room on their properties to deposit snow.

# CENSUS 101: WHAT YOU NEED TO

The 2020 Census is closer than you think! Here's a quick refresher of what it is and why it's essential that everyone is counted.

- ♦ The census counts every person living in the US once, and only once, and in the right place.
- ♦ Every 10 years, the results of the census are used to reapportion the House of Representatives, determining how many seats each state gets.
- ♦ The US Constitution mandates that everyone in the country be counted every 10 years. The first census was in 1790.
- ♦ The distribution of more than \$675 billion in federal funds, grants and support to states, counties and communities are based on census data. That money is spent on schools, hospitals, roads, public works, and other vital programs.
- After each decade's census, state officials redraw the boundaries of the congressional

- and state legislative districts in their states to account for population shifts.
- ♦ Completing the census is mandatory: It's a way to participate in our democracy and say, "I count!"
- Businesses, local governments, residents, and real estate developers use census data.
- ♦ It's against the law for the Census Bureau to publicly release your responses in any way that could identify you or your household. By law, your responses cannot be used against you and can only be used to produce statistics.
- ♦ In 2020, you will be able to respond to the census online.
- ♦ In 2010, Perch Lake's rate of response by mail was 80%.
- Minnesota snowbirds should be sure to complete a census. The official definition of where

snowbirds should count is simply wherever they live and sleep most of the time, according to the U.S. Census Bureau's 2020 residence criteria.
